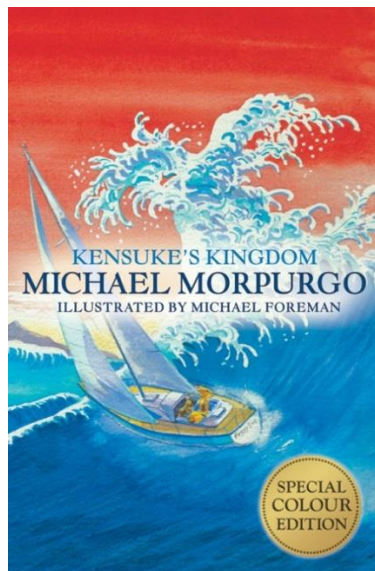

We are learning to:

<u>History</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify and describe changes within and between different periods in history.• Use and understands abstract terms such as empire, civilisation, parliament and peasantry.• Place events, people and changes into correct periods of time and the periods of time in chronological order.• Analyse sources of information for accuracy, usefulness and relevance and combines them to answer questions. Examine artefacts and explain what they show us about that time in history.
<u>Geograph</u> 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a scale drawing using scales based around the power of 10.• Locate the world's continents/countries including North and South America identifying key human and physical characteristics, countries and major cities.• Locate the position of the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, the Greenwich Meridian and times zones.• Locate places on an OS map using a 6 figure grid reference. Use a range of maps to plan the quickest route and find alternative routes.
<u>Art and Design</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Show how ideas have been improved.• Produce labelled diagrams for work.• Draw with pastel/charcoal, using the tip to create detail.• Draw with pastel/charcoal, blending and overlaying colours to create soft
